1. What is your happiest childhood memory?

Each summer when we would spend a few weeks down at a caravan park on the beach together with our cousins and their families, just running around barefoot through the sandhills, eating icecreams, and swimming in the ocean.

2. When did you join Toastmasters? What made you join?

Even though I already had some unsuccessful stints at public speaking clubs in Australia on my resume, I thought I would give it another shot, simply because I knew that I needed to change.

When I was younger I had serious aspirations in the former. Now that I am a little older, I have serious aspirations in the latter.

- Can you share random or surprising facts from your biography?
